



Medicaid Case Management for Children and Pregnant Women

Who can get a case manager?

- Children (birth to age 20) and pregnant women who get Medicaid;
- Have a medical or mental health problem; and
- Are at a high risk for getting medical or mental health problem.

What do case managers do?

A case manager will visit with the client or patient and then:

- Find out what services you need;
- Find services near where you live;
- Teach you how to find and get other services; and
- Make sure you are getting the services you need.

What kind of help can I get?

Case managers can help clients or patients get:

- Medical and dental services;
- Medical supplies or equipment;
- Access mental health services (psychological testing, assessment, and therapy)
- Work on school or education issues; and
- Referrals to other social services.
